These words work <u>as signals</u>; this means that there are more ideas to come. These words occur within sentences not at the beginning.

and also another and finally first of all again furthermore in addition more moreover next one reason other secondly similarly with too

With

Change-of-direction Words

These words mean: 'Watch out—we are <u>changing direction</u> of the argument' These words occur <u>within sentences</u> not at the beginning.

although but conversely

despite different from even though

however in contrast instead of

the opposite on the contrary on the other hand

rather still yet

while though

Sequence Words

These words indicate that there is <u>an order</u> to the following ideas/discussion/description.

first, second, third A,B,C

in the first place for one thing

then next
before now
after while
into until
last during
since always
later earlier

Illustration Words

These words let the reader know that an example will follow.

for example specifically for instance to illustrate such as focussing on in the same way including

Emphasis Words

These words and phrases signal that the information provided is important.

a major development importantly a significant factor most of all a primary concern most noteworthy a key feature the basic concept a central issue It should be noted a distinctive quality the critical criteria above all the main value especially relevant the crux of the matter important to note the principal item

Cause, Condition or Result Words

These words indicate that an explanation is following.

if of because for from so while then but that until since whether in order that as so that therefore unless thus due to yet

resulting from consequently

Spatial Words

These words <u>demonstrate</u> the direction of the argument.

between on by left here there right these close to this side near middle beside about under in front of away behind across into beyond above toward below opposite upon outside inside alongside over out far in adjacent near next to

Emphasis Signals

These are graphic formatting words that highlight specific words, ideas or sections.
